MESSAGE FROM OUR LOCUM VICAR

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

We are waiting for news about a possible new Vicar for the Parish. It seems the group is quite active and we heard about a successful recent community dinner, the process of applying for Council grants, shifting to solar energy and planned interfaith dialogues. CBD Taizé prayers are back up and running in the beautiful chapel at the Fitzroy campus of the Australian Catholic University. The ACU chapel is in the Daniel Mannix building. Enter via Brunswick street, come across the grass and through the glass doors, it's just on your right. In the style of the famous community at Taizé in France, Taize evening prayer is a simple and meditative form of worship for people of all Christian faiths, and includes very engaging songs.
